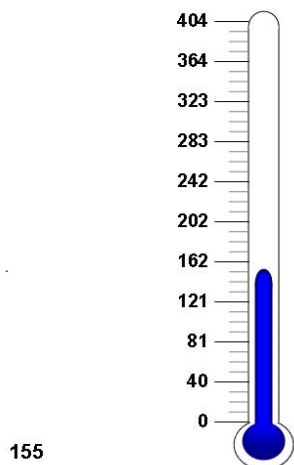

October is the month for Giving to OLLI

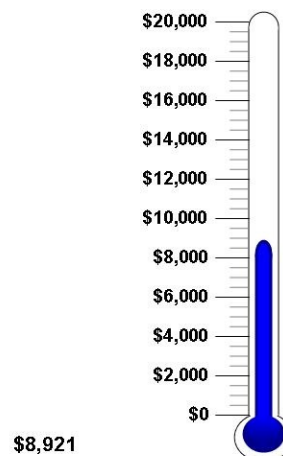

3. The subject of the poem must match the theme of the poetry contest: international or global issues, experiences, or understanding. Possible topics include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - International relations
 - Global issues
 - Experiences traveling abroad
 - Intercultural communication and relationships

4. The poem must be 50 or fewer lines. Poems longer than 50 lines will be disqualified. There is no restriction concerning style or form.
5. Poems must be submitted by Wednesday, November 1, 2017. There is no entry fee.
6. Finalists in each category will be selected by a committee of judges. These finalists will be invited to read their poems at an International Poetry Slam to be held Thursday, November 16 from 4:00-6:00 in the Johnson Auditorium in the Wall Building on Coastal Carolina University's main campus. Winning poems from each division will be announced at the end of the reading, and each of those poets will receive a \$50.00 award.
