

recycling

Why should you recycle?

Recycling conserves natural resources, saves energy, reduces pollution, saves landfill space and provides economic benefits.

University Housing Recycling: Students who live



on campus can recycle by using the yellow bin provided by Sustain Coastal. Students must empty their recyclables in a central location outside the residence halls.

Campus Recycling: Students, staff and faculty



can recycle paper, newspaper, magazines, plastic bottles, metal cans, glass bottles and cardboard at designated campus locations. Look for receptacles inside and outside buildings.

Cell Phones, Batteries and Ink Cartridges: The



main recycling locations for these items include Coastal Science Center, Baxley Hall, Edwards Building, Kearns Hall, Kimbel Library, Prince Building, Singleton Building, Smith Science Center, Student Center and Wall Building.

Event Recycling: Events and meetings gener-



ate bottles, cans and cardboard. If you are hosting an event or a meeting on campus, contact the Green Team at 843-349-5041. Event recycling is a free service provided by Sustain Coastal.

Water Refill Station: Why buy a bottle of water when you can easily refill a personal refillable bottle? Choose to refill your own bottle or a cup at one of the free Water Refill Stations on campus. The refill stations provide filtered water and are located in Kimbel Library, Arcadia Hall, Coastal Science Center, Student Center, Williams Brice Building and other campus locations coming soon.

Reduce: Turn off unnecessary lights and unplug electronics and appliances when not in use. These items draw power even when they're switched off or not in use, just by being plugged in. This "phantom



energy" accounts for about 10 percent of home electricity use.

Save Gas: If you live close to campus, invest in a bicycle or borrow a bicycle from Campus Recreation's Coastal Cycles program. Call Campus Recreation at 843-349-2802.

Discount Drinks: Dining Services offers a discount on beverages when you bring your reusable mug or cup to Java City or CINO Grille.

Cardboard Crew: In August, when students move back to campus, a lot of cardboard is generated. The Cardboard Crew helps separate out the cardboard and recycles it. Cardboard takes up the most space in the landfill, so recycling helps.



Campus Salvage: Outgoing students leave a lot of stuff behind. Campus Salvage collects end-of-the-year donations and sells items at a yard sale in the community. Proceeds from the yard sale benefit the sustainability program, and donations of clothing, bedding and food go to various non-profit organizations.




green solutions

Walk: An easy, free solution in getting from place to place and another way to stay healthy.

Take the Free Shuttle: The shuttle is available for everyone to use for free with six stops throughout campus. Arriving every 15 minutes, the shuttle provides a convenient traveling method with no parking or gas worries.


